GRADE 1 & GRADE 2







Grade 1 is studying the seasonal changes and its impact on living things. We walked through the pumpkin patch to examine how pumpkins grow.

Grade 2 is studying animal growth and changes this year. We got to learn the names of father, mother, and baby animals of llamas, goats, sheep, donkeys, chickens, rabbits, and cows. Students were able to interact with some of these animals and feed them.

This trip allowed for community building to happen in small groups across both classes. In the afternoon, students were able to participate in fun activities such as: corn mazes, ziplining, playing in the Western Fort, riding in the Barnyard Boxcars, finding the cow stations in the Moo Maze, and zipping around on pedal cars.

The shoeboxes contained items such as winter gloves, socks, a chocolate treat, hot chocolate, and a notebook and pen. The class did a wonderful job of wrapping and packing these gifts.

This term we decided that we wanted to invest our time and efforts into donating to a local charity. With lots of help from parents, the grade 7 class organized a bake sale to raise funds. We ended up making 100 dozen cookies and raising \$1,650. We feel blessed by the community of grandparents and parents that came out to purchase items from our fundraising table and generously partner with us on this outreach project.

We work on sight words, reading, and listening skills, all while having fun! 




