GRADE 2



On Friday, May 31, the grade 5 class went to the Simcoe County Museum. We participated in a program called "One trade, two cultures" We learned about the Indigenous tribes local to our area, experienced some trading between the French and the Wendat tribes, and played a board game where the goal was to collect beaver pelts as we made our way in canoes. In the afternoon we did an orienteering game in the yard surrounding the museum and then cooked our own bannock over an open fire. We had a great time learning and experiencing.









The grade 6 class demonstrated their ability to create electric circuits when they constructed trivia games for the Celebration of Learning. Each game consisted of questions relating to a topic learned in grade 6 this year. Some examples of game topics were, art techniques, Bible, math, geography, vocabulary and book trivia.







GRADE 7

Grade 7 has enjoyed the past two months filled with school events, classroom programs and community building activities. In May, we had track and field day where a number of our grade 7 students made it to districts and our very own, Chase and Joel, beat the school record in the 100m dash. Though both boys beat the record, Chase set a new record at 13.25 seconds. For the past few months, the grade 7 class has been engaged in a financial literacy program that has promoted the use of managing money in a responsible manner through budgeting, practical life skills and good work ethic. We have also begun our final project in our science unit, Structures and Mechanisms. Students are tasked with creating a bridge that can sustain up to 150 lbs using specific materials and creating architectural drawings that acknowledge the internal and external forces acting on the bridge.







Grade 8 has had an incredible time over the past few months, filled with memorable events and activities. We've enjoyed badminton, track and field day, the golf marathon, and the excitement of districts. As we look forward to our upcoming Grad trip and Graduation, we reflect on the hard work and dedication that brought us here. Students put in great effort on their replicas of Corrie Ten Boom's "hiding place" and delivered a fantastic band performance for our celebration of learning. We had the privilege of working through the Alpha course together as a class, what a blessing these sessions were! It's been a fantastic journey, and we are thankful to the Lord for his presence in our classroom.






BATTLE OF THE BOOKS
