Solar Eclipse	On April 8, 2024 there will be a solar eclipse. In York Region we will experience the effects of the eclipse between approximately 2 PM and 4:30 PM. This time frame coincides with the dismissal time at KCS. In light of the concerns for students being outside and inadvertently looking at the sun, which could potentially cause harm such as loss of eyesight, we have made a change to our schedule that day. Out of concern for student safety, on April 8, 2024, <u>students will be dismissed</u> <u>at 12 noon</u> . Buses will conduct their usual routes, but they will start their runs at noon instead of 3:30 PM. There will be no school for the afternoon that day. Parents need to make arrangements to ensure that students are supervised that afternoon. Parents who pick up their children at school in vehicles need to plan to pick up their children at 12 noon that day as well. Thank you for your understanding of this unusual situation.

CHESS CLUB	Students have enjoyed the challenge of learning and developing their chess skills through the chess club opportunity. According to Healthline, an online health web site, there are many benefits to playing chess including developing perspective, improving memory, deepening focus, elevating creativity and boosting planning skills. We hope that the students who have joined the chess club will share tips and strategies with family members and continue to grow in their skill!
Pastors' Breakfast	On April 10th, KCS is excited to welcome pastors to breakfast and a special program. There are dozens of churches far and wide of various denominations represented by KCS families and our hope is to forge strong connections with the churches. When our faith and hope align between home, school and church, a child is truly building a foundation on biblical truth. Students will be given invitations to share with their pastors in the coming weeks.
Knitting Club Service Project	This term a knitting club came together to knit 8-inch knitted squares for a very special project. Missionary Helen Jones visited KCS on February 23rd to explain how the squares are packaged and sent by shipping container to Zomba, Malawi by Africycle. Once there, a widows' sewing group takes the squares and sews them into a 35-square blanket for a child who may be orphaned and/or in severe need. We are proud of our knitters who are using their time to serve others and to be a blessing to those in need.
The Grade 7's and Sainte Marie Among the Hurons	The grade 7 class at KCS had the privilege of travelling to Sainte Marie Among the Hurons in January to experience the life, culture and history of the First Nations people in community with Jesuit priests. Experiences included storytelling around a fire in a longhouse, quill pen writing, wood carving, tea sampling, corn husk doll-making, and eating bannock roasted over the fire. Olivia V., a grade 7 student said, "I really liked learning about how they lived in a different time and hearing about how the Jesuits had to learn how to survive." A few weeks after this trip, Carl, an Indigenous police officer, visited the grade 7 class to answer questions about First Nations' perspectives and modern day life for Indigenous people. Finally, the pen pal writing program continues to allow grade 7 students to build relationships with First Nations kids living on reserve in southern Ontario. We are pleased that KCS students are developing a greater awareness of some of our neighbours and understanding how we can demonstrate the love of Christ.

SU Sports Partnership	KCS, in partnership with the Christian Home Educators' Network of York Region and Scripture Union Sports, has enjoyed an 8-week after school sports and Bible study program. Almost 50 children from KCS and CHEN enjoyed learning and growing in their sports abilities and Bible knowledge. KCS looks forward to a continued partnership with SU Sports in the coming months.
Intramural Soccer and Basketball	This term grade 4 and 5 students have been invited to participate in intramural soccer and grade 5 and 6 students have had the opportunity to participate in intramural basketball. Having organized sports for students allows them to practice skills and game playing. We are so thankful for parent volunteers Coach John and Coach James who have stepped up to help us!
Math Olympics	Congratulations to the KCS Math Olympics teams. On February 7th they travelled to Orillia Christian School to compete against other teams in Math challenges. For the grade 8s, Brenton won the first-place medal and Connor won the second-place medal. For the grade 7s, Lily won the first-place medal, Isabelle won the second-place medal and Chase won the third-place medal. The two grade 7 teams tied and won the group competition and received the plaque. For the grade 6s, Melody won the first-place medal and Jason won the second-place medal.
