(Centre for the Advancement of Christian Education) and involves putting our deep hope for our students and school at the centre of what we do every day at KCS. As teachers make evident their deep hope for their students and choose an over-arching biblical theme for their classes, students see, hear and experience the throughlines of the biblical truths woven through every curricular area. Here is one TfT story from KCS: Andrea Veldhoen, grade 3-4 teacher, chose as her deep hope statement, "Together, they explore and encounter God, to learn to become a conduit for his redemptive work." The theme for the year for this class is: Together Rooted in Christ, to Grow and Reach Out! Students are exploring what they can learn from God's creation through inquiry. Isaiah



55:12 provides some insights: "For you shall go out in joy and be led forth with peace; The mountains and the hills before you shall break forth into singing and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands." The students are learning how to worship God, how to appreciate the things God made, and how to take care of His beautiful creation.

Matthew V., a student in the class wrote this poem:

"God, I'm thankful for the leaves I can hear and see,

For the pretty colours that float around me."

The class tree, named Freddy by the students, is a daily reminder of what they are learning about God and creation.

The new online GIVE Program is up and running. If you still have not had a chance to login, please visit: <a href="https://portal.onvolunteers.com/login.aspx?s=kcs">https://portal.onvolunteers.com/login.aspx?s=kcs</a> and login with your email and the temporary password KCS@2023. Each family at KCS is required to give a minimum of 30 hours for the 2023/2024 school year; with 25 hours going to school support and 5 hours to be completed in fundraising. Uncompleted hours will be calculated at \$50/hour.

From the new online GIVE portal you can:

- View and register for volunteer opportunities online
- Keep track of your completed and remaining hours (system automatically tracks hours as they're completed)
- Submit any extra tasks and/or time you've volunteered for via AD HOC request
- Add your unique skills to your profile to help KCS find volunteer opportunities to suit your abilities

Please remember to sign-in/sign-out on the tablet at the office for any volunteer opportunities that you've signed up for that take place at KCS during school hours. You will need your 4-digit PIN for the tablet. Your PIN can be found on the home screen of your online portal in RED.

Hours done outside of school/hours or any extra hours submitted under AD HOC request will be verified. Admin cannot 'give out' any GIVE hours. It is up to **you** to sign-up for volunteer tasks and submit any extra hours via AD HOC request.
